Compound Adjectives

In general we put an hyphen between two a more words before a noun when we want them to act as a single idea that describes something. This association is generally referred to as a « Compound Adjectives ».

e.g : I live in an Arabic- speaking country.

Daily- drip irrigated plants

How do we know when to put an hyphen?

1. No hyphen

a. If we use the word « and » between the two adjectives or words.

e.g: She has a big blue book. She has a big and blue book.

- b. Between an adverb and an adjective
- e. g: It is a very hot day.

2.1. Compound adjective : - ing form

- b. bject complement.

A boy that eats meat \Rightarrow A meat – eating boy

c. The structure implies the presence of adverb with verb.

A war which lasted a long time \Rightarrow A long – lasting war.

2.2. Counpound adjectives : - ed form

a. The structure implies a passive contraction.

A spray equipment that is mounted on a tractor \Rightarrow A tractor – mounted spray equipment.

A door which is operated hydraulically \Rightarrow A hydraulically - operated door.
